NEW BUSINESS:

1. **Washington County Council of Government awarded Road Salt Bid providers:** The WCCG successful bidder was New England Salt with a bid of \$60.25 per ton. A motion was made by Selectman Alley, seconded by Selectman Fish to order winter salt through New England Salt at the above price.
2. **Charlie Look:** Mr. Look requested that Jonesport Ave. be discontinued by the Town. He was informed by the Selectmen on the procedure to discontinue a road which starts with a letter from each property owner along Jonesport Ave. This letter to the Town, with this request for discontinuance, must also state that they will not ask for any compensation from the Town.

OLD BUSINESS

3. **Sunrise Care Facility:** No update.
4. **PRSWDD:** No more needs to be done with PRSWDD per Attorney Hamer until March when an article will appear on the annual Town Warrant for 2019.
5. **Sandy River Beach:** A sign has been ordered to be placed at the Beach requesting that beach users respect property owners, pick up after their dogs and keep them on a leash or under voice control.
6. **IGA-Inspection Results:** No update – to be placed on agenda for next week.
7. **Fire Rd:** A motion was made by Selectman Milliken, seconded by Selectman Fish to ask that David Look with Ouelette Construction be contacted to grade the road.

The second issue concerning the Fire Road is that a court date will be set shortly in regard to the junkyard.
8. **Jewett Rd:** The Selectmen would like to have a meeting with all members of the Clam Committee to determine what the consensus wants as far as access to the shore.

9. **Prime for Life:** Terri Woodruff will be having free community training at the Peabody Memorial Library on Sept. 18th and 19th from 4:30 p.m.-7:00 p.m. Free \$20 gas cards will be given to all participants that complete both sessions.
10. **WCCOG-Sept 25 6-8pm @ Crystal's Office** -final Executive Committee meeting for fiscal year. – Selectman Fish will attend.
11. **CTMA (Community Television Association of Maine):** Selectman Fish reported that this was never discussed at the LPC meeting, so he had no new information.
12. **EPA Healthy Indoor:** The Selectmen showed interest in this project but felt that the deadline of September 25th was too soon to submit an application.
13. **Consolidated (FairPoint) - Internet @ Mason Bay Rd:** The Selectmen would like Jeff Nevins to give the Economic Development an overview of what Consolidated Communications can offer the Town. A meeting of the EDC will be called once info becomes available.
14. **Concern on Road Drains on Main St:** John Church reported that he has contacted MDOT and that the three primary drain problems will be taken care of by late fall.
15. **Daniel Rocks:** The porta potty issue resolved itself. The request was withdrawn.
16. **Proclamation for Roads:** A motion was made by Selectman Milliken, seconded by Selectman Fish that all roads maintained by the Town for at least 30 years will be considered town roads. All in favor.
17. **Garrett Corbin – Broadband Grand Pilot Program Comments:** The Selectmen had no comments to add to the proposal for this program.
18. **Letters for Charlie Alley:** Selectmen Milliken has a draft started but would like terms for each area of town government that Charlie served so he can include them in his letter.

MISCELLANEOUS:

Ice Hill South: Selectman Milliken brought to the attention of the Board that there was a discrepancy in the discontinuance order and the article for the Special Town meeting. He talked to the Town attorney and was informed that as long as all parties accepted the article as read this would not hinder the outcome in any way.

Harbor Ramp at Marina: There is a dip in the ramp which will eventually become a hole. John Church, as asst. harbor master, will contact the State about this problem, as the Marina is State owned.

A motion was made by Selectman Alley, seconded by Selectman Fish to adjourn the meeting at 5:10 p.m.
