OLD BUSINESS:

1. **IGA BUILDING:** A public hearing was held. See minutes of Sept. 25th.
2. **Rockwell Rd: Update:** no update
3. **Fire Road: Update:** An agreement was drafted and signed by Holli and Justin Finkle and the Selectmen. It allows for preparation of a school bus turn around on the Finkle property. David Look also needs to check out the culvert as part of the improvements..
4. **Adult Use Recreational Marijuana:** The Adult Use Recreational Marijuana Ordinance is a work in progress. Maine has not finalized the related rules and regulations at this time.
5. **Charlie & Kayla Chandler: update:** Selectman Alley and Bo Beal checked out the culvert in question and ran water through it. Both ends were clogged with sand. The fire dept. may need to blow the dirt out of the culvert if Selectman Alley and Bo weren't successful.

NEW BUSINESS:

8. **Fire Substation:** An email was received from a concerned property owner asking if the Jonesport Substation was up to code as required by the State or insurance companies. Boyde Crowley will be contacted asking what the rules and regulations are for a substation.

MISCELLANEOUS:

9. **Stream Crossing Grants:** Selectman Fish reported he had talked to Judy East about getting a grant to fix the culvert on the Kelley Point Road. Ms. East feels the Town should pursue a grant as the Kelley Point Road would qualify.
10. **Dance - Fire Station by Ambulance BYOB:** The dinner /dance was approved by the Selectmen.
11. **Name a road:** A motion was made by Selectman Milliken, seconded by Selectman Fish to name the road off Alexander Ave., the Hay Creek Road.

12. **Tax Agreement, Acct#1056:** A motion was made by Selectman Milliken, seconded by Selectman Alley to approve the payment plan as presented.
13. **Campground:** Selectman Fish presented a plan of the Campground Road showing what work was needed. The cost would be \$256,000. for the improvements. Also, there is a young apple tree that someone wanted to take from the side of the road. A motion was made by Selectman Alley, seconded by Selectman Fish to allow the person to dig up the apple tree.
14. **Ice Skating Party:** All citizens are welcome to use the ice skating rink as long as no debris is left behind. Lights need to be turned on also.
15. The new owner of the Swett property wants to tear it down or have it burned. Selectman Fish made a motion to have the fire dept. burn it down as a possible training opportunity, if approved by the fire chief, seconded by Selectman Alley. All in favor.
