TOWN OF JONESPORT ANNUAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT March 09, 2020 – 3:30 p.m. DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME JONESPORT-BEALS HIGH SCHOOL GYM

Tonia Merchant, Clerk, called the meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. Pastor Phyllis Merritt opened with prayer and Tonia led in the salute to our Country's flag.

To: Howard Mills, a resident of the Town of Jonesport, in the County of Washington, State of Maine.

Greetings: In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Jonesport, qualified to vote in Town Affairs, to assemble at the Jonesport-Beals High School Gymnasium at Snare Creek, in said Town on Monday, the nineth (9th) day of March, 2020, at 3:30 p.m., to act on the following articles, to wit:

Motion was made and seconded to dispense the reading of the warrant in its entirety; none opposed.

ARTICLE 1: To elect, by ballot, a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
 Nomination was made and seconded for William (Billy) Milliken.
 Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed.
 10 votes were cast for William (Billy) Milliken.

Billy appointed Harry Fish, Jr. to be his deputy moderator. Billy also explained that he would be using the Maine Moderator's Manual as the rules for governing the meeting. At this point, Billy turned the meeting over to his deputy, Harry Fish.

ARTICLE 2: To elect the necessary member(s) of the Board of Selectmen to serve for a three (3) year term.
 Nomination was made and seconded for William (Billy) Milliken.
 Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed.
 12 votes were cast for William (Billy) Milliken.

At this point Harry turned the meeting back over to Billy.

A motion was made and seconded to allow non-residents Bill McDonald and three Kingfish

representatives to speak during the meeting.

The motion carried 55-0.

Article 3: To elect one individual who will serve the three (3) positions of Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, and Tax Collector for a three (3) year term.

Nomination was made and seconded for Tonia Merchant. Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed. 13 votes were cast for Tonia Merchant.

ARTICLE 4: To elect the necessary member(s) of the Board of Assessors for a three (3) year term.
 Nomination was made and seconded for Jean Guptill.
 Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed.
 9 votes were cast for Jean Guptill.

ARTICLE 5: To elect the necessary member(s) of the Jonesport School Committee, who will also be member(s) of the Moosabec Community School District School Committee. Nomination was made and seconded for Ernest Kelley, Jr.

Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed. 9 votes were cast for Ernest Kelley, Jr.

- ARTICLE 6: To elect the necessary member(s) of the Moosabec Community School District
 Committee. Nomination was made and seconded for Loren Faulkingham.
 Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed.
 9 votes were cast for Loren Faulkingham.
- ARTICLE 7: To elect the necessary member(s) of the Moosabec Community School District Board of Trustees.
 Nomination was made and seconded for Clifford Norton, III.
 Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed.
 6 votes were cast for Clifford Norton, III.
- ARTICLE 8: To elect three (3) Overseers of General Assistance.
 Motion was made and seconded to elect the Board of Selectmen to be the Overseers of General Assistance.
 Motion carried; none opposed.
- ARTICLE 9: To elect a Fire Chief/Fire Inspector.
 Nomination was made and seconded for Boyde Crowley.
 Motion was made and seconded for nominations to cease; none opposed.
 11 votes were cast for Boyde Crowley.

ARTICLE 10: To see if the Town will authorize the Town Selectmen to appoint a committee of five (5) to govern and enforce the Shellfish Conservation Ordinance regarding shellfish harvesting. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Motion carried; none opposed.

ARTICLE 11: To see what the Town will vote to charge for interest on delinquent Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for Year 2020, if said taxes are not paid by the delinquent date of December 31,

2020. (The State Treasurer has determined 9% (nine and 00/100 percent) as the highest conventional rate of interest for Year 2020.)

Motion was made and seconded to approve the article with 3% interest. Motion carried; none opposed.

ARTICLE 12: To see if the Town will vote to allow a 3% (three percent) discount on all Real Estate and Personal Property Taxes for the Year 2020, if taxes are paid in full on or before thirty (30) days from post office mailing date of tax bills by the Tax Collector. (MRSA, Title 36, Section 505).

Motion was made and seconded to approve the article with 0% discount. Motion carried; 6 opposed.

ARTICLE 13: If the town votes yes on Article 12, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to
raise and appropriate for the Tax Discount.**SR/BCR: \$40,000.00**

No action was taken because no discount was approved in article 12.

ARTICLE 14: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the tax collector or treasurer to accept prepayments of taxes not yet committed, pursuant to MRSA, Title 36, Section 506. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Motion carried; none opposed.

Article 18: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow or appropriate from unappropriated surplus as they deem advisable, to meet unanticipated expenses and emergencies that occur during the Fiscal Year 2020-2021. (Creation of some form of contingency account can often avoid the necessity of calling a number of special town meetings during the year when relatively minor issues can be resolved with the expenditure of minor funds, but monies have not been appropriated for those purposes.) Not an Appropriation SR/ BCR: \$20,000

Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read with the recommended amount of \$20,000. Motion carried; none opposed.

ARTICLE 19: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the town for nonpayment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable to the best interest of the Town, and to execute Quit Claim Deeds for such property after three (3) weeks of publication in a local newspaper.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Motion carried; none opposed.

ARTICLE 20: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, if permissible, to apply for, accept, and expend Federal and State Grant Funds during Fiscal Year 2020-2021; i.e., Community Development Block Grants; Public Facilities/Infrastructure Programs for Building Construction/Wastewater Systems/Wells; Small Community Grants (Wastewater systems); Maine Community Foundation; Maine Historic Preservation Comm.; Federal Emergency Mitigation Assistance Grants (FEMA) and Maine Emergency Mitigation Assistance (MEMA); Dept of Transportation's Small Harbor Improvements Program (SHIP); Eastern Maine Development Corp., and any other grants which would be beneficial to the Town.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Motion carried; none opposed.

ARTICLE 21: To see if the town will vote to authorize the municipal officers to make final determinations regarding the closing or opening of roads to winter maintenance pursuant to MRSA, Title 23, Section
 2953. Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as read. Motion carried; none opposed.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the article with the recommended amount. Motion carried; none opposed.

Article 35: To see if the Town will vote to accept \$118,000 from the Land for Maine's Future to buy an easement at the Campground/Marina. These funds will be retained for the Town's future project needs, specifically for Working Waterfront Access.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as written. Motion carried; none opposed.

Article 36: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$25,000 from surplus to purchase an update to the Town's Comprehensive Plan from the Washington County Council of Governments. The funds will be paid back over a two year period.

Motion was made and seconded to withdraw up to the sum of \$25,000 to be paid back over a two-year period.

Motion carried; none opposed.

Article 37: To see if the Town will vote to raise \$20,000, as the Town's share of a Stream Crossing Grant, to rebuild the stream overflow on the Kelley Point Road. (Stillman's Creek). A grant of \$66,000 has been awarded to the Town from DEP.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the article to raise \$20,000. Motion carried; none opposed.

Article 38: To see if the Town would approve the relocation of the current fire sub-station area on Mason Bay Road – to the area which includes: the sand shed, picnic area and tables.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the article as written.

After much discussion the question was called. Call the question passed 45-3. The motion failed with only one in favor.

Article 39: To see if the Town will vote to abolish the elected board of assessors and create in its place the office of a single assessor to be appointed by the Selectmen pursuant to 30-1 M.R.S.2526(5), effective at the 2021 annual town meeting. The assessor shall perform all duties and responsibilities provided for assessors under general law. The Selectmen shall determine the salary, hours and working conditions of the assessor. The assessor may be removed by the Selectmen for cause after notice and hearing. Cause shall not include any disagreement with respect to an assessing practice employed by the assessor where such practice is generally accepted and lawful.

Motion made and seconded to accept the article as written. Motion carried; none opposed.

Article 40: To see if the Town will vote for the Selectmen to appoint an individual as Town Treasurer, Tax Collector and Clerk, effective at the 2023 annual town meeting. The term of the appointment shall be for three years. The appointee shall perform the duties and responsibilities provided for Town Treasurer, Tax Collector and Clerk under general law. The Selectmen shall determine the salary, hours and working conditions. The Treasurer, Tax Collector and Clerk may be removed by the Selectmen for

just cause, after notice and hearing. Cause shall not include any disagreement with respect to accountant duties employed by the Treasurer, Tax Collector and Clerk, where such practice is generally accepted and lawful.

Motion made and seconded to accept the article as written. Motion carried; none opposed

Motion was made and seconded at 6:23 p.m. to adjourn; none opposed.
